Edward J. Kvet is Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Loyola University New Orleans. Prior to his appointment as Provost in 2008, he served as Dean of the College of Music and Fine Arts from 1998-2008, Director of the School of Music at Central Michigan University from 1990 - 1998, Coordinator of Music Education at Loyola University New Orleans from 1982 to 1984 and Associate Dean from 1984 - 1990. He has also taught at the University of Cincinnati, Edgecliff College in Ohio, and in the Wyoming and Finneytown public school districts in Ohio. Provost Kvet currently serves as a member of the Commission on Accreditation for the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) and has served as Chair of the Committee on Ethics and Vice Chair of Region 5. He has held elective offices in the Ohio Music Education Association, Louisiana Music Educators Association and served as president of the Michigan Music Educators Association. Provost Kvet has presented numerous workshop and clinic sessions for public school districts, state arts organizations, MENC and NASM, and serves as an accreditation visitor for NASM. He currently serves as a featured speaker at fund raising seminars sponsored by the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE), as a fund raising consultant to various colleges and universities, and was recently awarded the Steuben Apple Award for outstanding teaching by CASE. He has authored numerous books and articles on band literature and organization, designed to assist public school music educators in implementing the national voluntary K - 12 music standards, and experimental research studies in music education. Provost Kvet has a bachelor of music education degree from Baldwin-Wallace College and master's and doctoral degrees in music education from the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music.
