Table 3 summarizes the annual number of degrees awarded per major/program over the last eleven years. It also lists the major/programs with their start and/or end term date, if relevant. A review of the table indicates the following facts:

(1) Since the 94-95 Academic Year the number of undergraduate programs has decreased from 89 to 82 with most of the decrease due to programs ending within City College and Music. At the same time the average number of degrees awarded per program has increased from 8.0 to 10.6.

(2) The average number of degrees awarded per program is lowest in Music with fewer than eight degrees awarded per program occurring each of the past eleven academic years. Similarly, Arts & Sciences has awarded on average nine or fewer degrees per program for each of the past eleven academic years. Business in the past four years has had approximately 29 or more degrees awarded per program and City College has averaged ten to twelve undergraduate degrees awarded per program.

(3) Twenty-one programs have awarded 10 or fewer degrees in each of the 03-04 and 04-05 academic years. These programs are classics, the Communication sequences of film studies and photo journalism, A&S economics, all foreign languages, math, physics, religious studies, City College computer studies, human and organizational development, humanities, social science, jazz, music composition, music liberal arts, piano pedagogy, performance, and therapy.

(4) Besides the programs awarding ten or fewer degrees (listed above), another eleven programs have awarded 20 or fewer degrees in each of the two most recent academic years. These programs are: chemistry majors combined, A&S computer studies programs, A&S criminal justice, elementary education, philosophy, accounting, Business economics, music education and the communication sequences of Broadcast Production and Journalism, and Print Journalism.

(5) Seventeen programs each awarded a total of 40 degrees or more over the past two academic years. These programs are: Biology (69), Advertising (61), Communications studies (43), Public Relations (45), English (99), History (65), Political Science (61), Psychology (148), Sociology (60), Visual Arts (51), Finance (60), International Business (52), Management (82), Marketing (127), City College Criminal Justice (65), all Nursing (82), and Music Industry (59).
